

PE Assessment: Net and Wall Games

Learning objective: To show your understanding of tactics, skills, and safety in net and wall games.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you spell your answers. Answer in full sentences where possible.

Max the monkey is learning about net and wall games. He knows that in games like tennis or badminton, you must hit the ball or shuttlecock over a net. In wall games, you hit a ball against a wall so it bounces back to your partner. Max always remembers to look around to make sure he has enough space to play safely.

1. Name one piece of equipment you might use to hit a ball in a net game. (1 mark)

2. Why is it important to look for empty space before you start playing? (2 marks)

3. What do we call the start of a game when you hit the ball to your opponent? (1 mark)

4. Max is playing a game against a wall. Describe two things he should do to make sure he keeps the ball in play. (4 marks)

5. Explain why it is important to communicate with your partner during a game. Use a sentence starter: 'It is important to talk to my partner because...' (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a net or a wall game. Show where the player is standing and where the ball is going.
