

Net and Wall Games Flashcards

What is a net in a game?

A mesh barrier that divides the court in two.

What is a serve?

The shot used to start a game or a rally.

What is a rally?

When players hit the ball or shuttlecock back and forth.

What is an opponent?

The person or team you are playing against.

What is a court?

The marked area where the game is played.

What is a point?

What you win when you hit the ball so your opponent cannot return it.

What does accuracy mean?

Aiming carefully to land the ball in the right spot.

What is control?

Being able to hit the ball exactly where you want it to go.

What is a wall game?

A game where you hit a ball against a wall, like squash.

Why do we use a racket?

To hit the ball or shuttlecock further and with more power.
