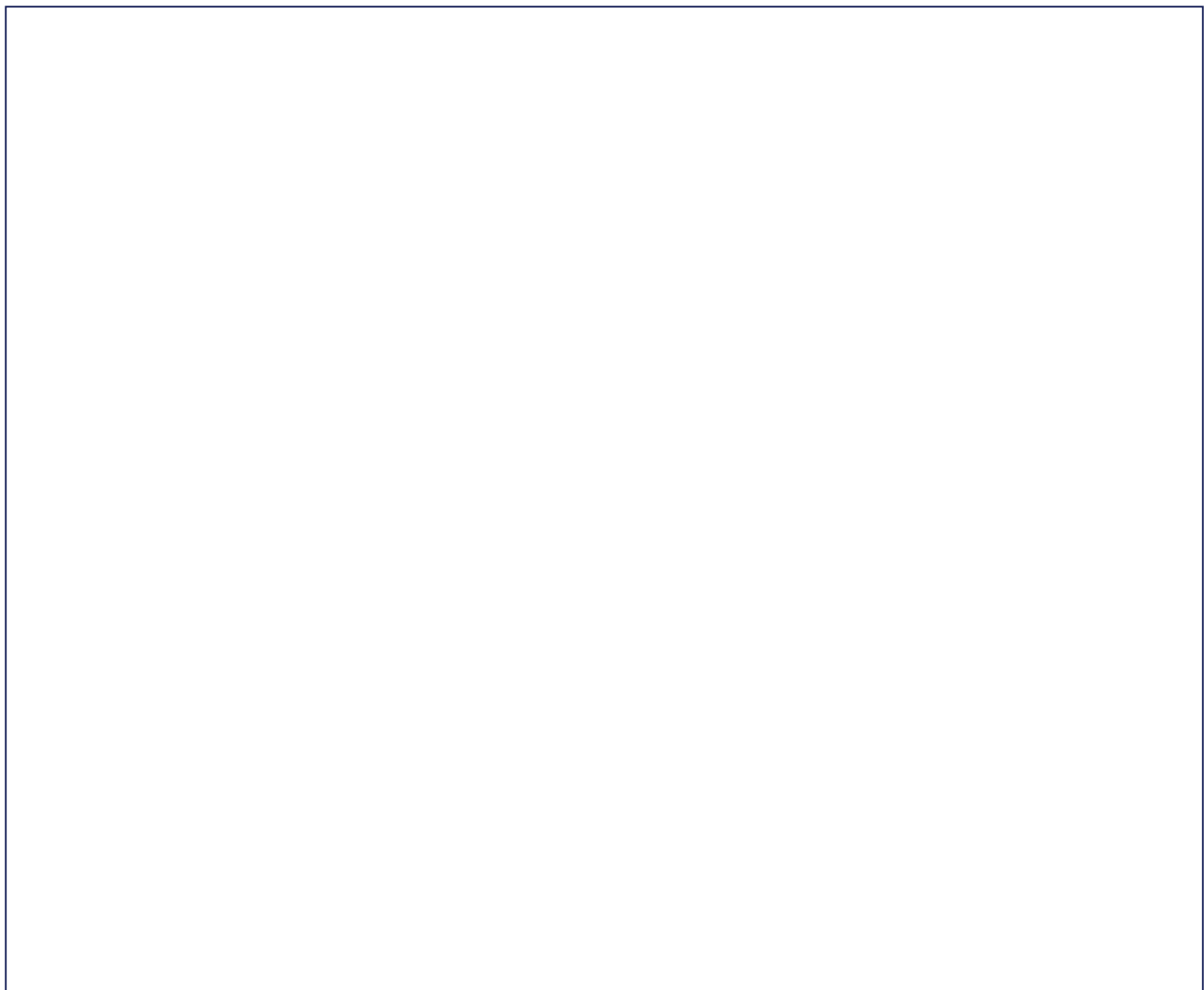


# The Pillars of Friendship: A Visual Exploration

*Learning objective: To understand the qualities that constitute positive, healthy friendships and how these actions manifest in our daily interactions.*

Use this sheet to illustrate the 'Garden of Friendship' with Leo the Lion. Think about the traits that help a friendship grow strong and resilient. Use your drawing to show these values in action.

**Draw:** Draw a vibrant 'Garden of Friendship' featuring Leo the Lion and a group of diverse friends. In the centre, draw Leo sharing a story. Around him, illustrate specific scenes representing the qualities in the word bank (e.g., two characters helping each other over an obstacle to show 'Support', or two characters looking at each other while one speaks to show 'Active Listening'). Use a bright, inviting colour palette and clear labels for your chosen values.



*Label words: Empathy · Trust · Loyalty · Support · Forgiveness · Active Listening · Reliability · Honesty*

## Steps:

1. Explain why 'Trust' is often considered the foundation of a strong friendship. Use an example to justify your answer.
2. Compare and contrast a 'fair-weather friend' with a 'loyal friend'. How do their actions differ during difficult times?

3. What might happen to a friendship if 'Honesty' is missing? Explain the long-term impact on the bond.
4. Label your drawing to show where you have included 'Active Listening'. Describe what this looks like in your scene.
5. Justify why 'Forgiveness' is an essential component of long-lasting friendships.
6. If you were to add one more quality to the 'Garden of Friendship', what would it be and why is it valuable?
