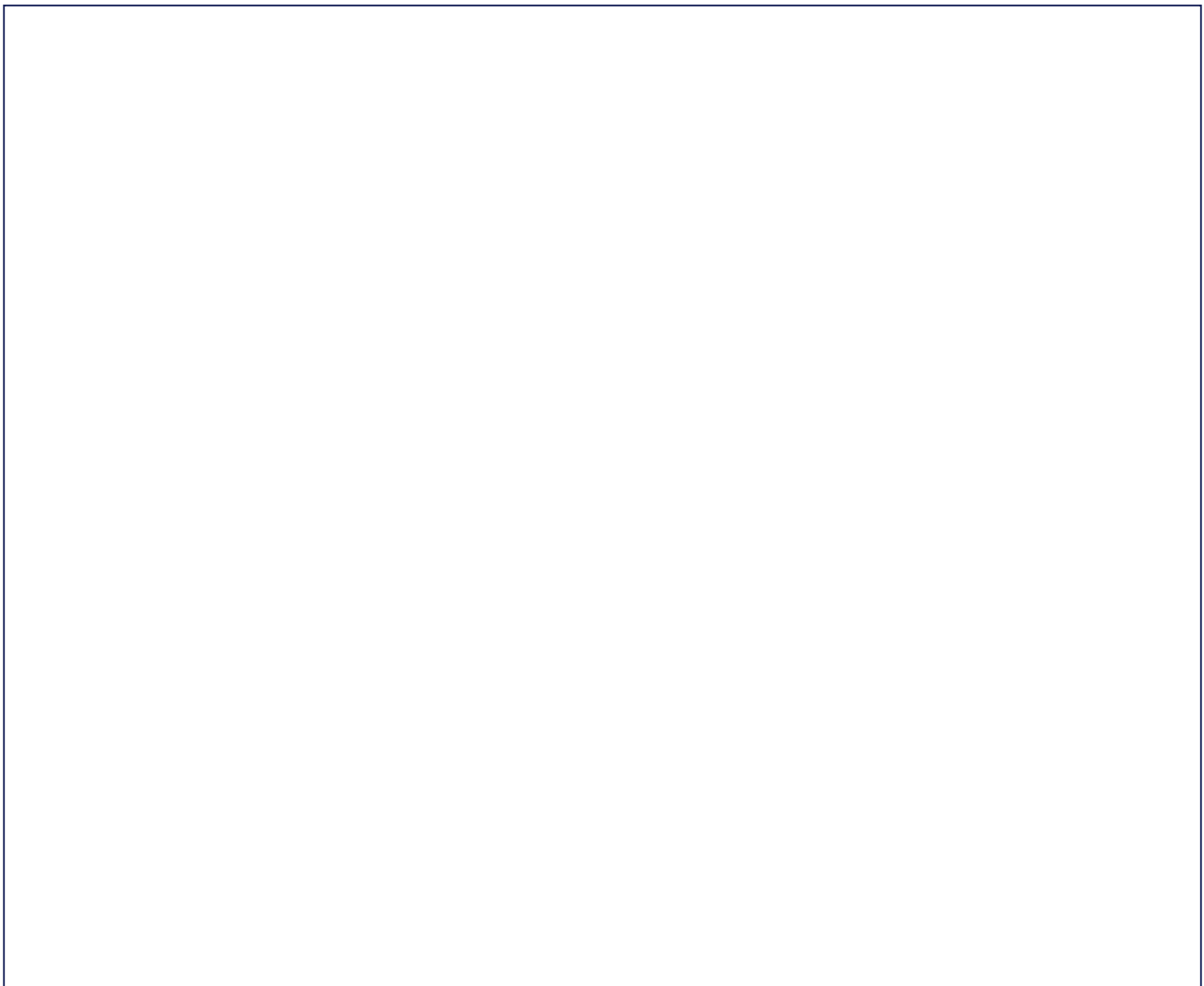


Celebrating Eid: A Moment of Joy

Learning objective: To understand the significance and visual traditions of Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha through creative illustration.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own scene celebrating Eid. Use the word bank to label the key features of your artwork. Ensure your drawing reflects the community spirit and traditions associated with the festivals.

Draw: Create a detailed scene showing an Eid celebration. Include a group of people sharing a meal, intricate henna patterns on hands, and decorative lanterns or bunting. Use a bright, celebratory colour palette. In the sky, draw a thin, elegant crescent moon. Ensure your style is respectful and captures the warmth of a festive gathering.



Label words: Crescent moon · Zakat · Henna · Community · Gift-giving · Eid prayer · Calligraphy · Generosity

Steps:

1. Explain why the act of Zakat (charity) is considered a fundamental part of the Eid celebrations. Justify your answer using the concept of community.
2. Label three specific items in your drawing that represent the traditions of Eid.
3. Compare and contrast how the atmosphere of Eid might differ from a regular school day. What makes this time special?

4. What might happen if a community did not share food or gifts during Eid? Explain the impact on the spirit of the festival.
5. Describe the colours you have chosen for your drawing. Why do these colours represent joy and celebration in your illustration?
6. How does the sighting of the crescent moon influence the start of Eid? Summarise the importance of the lunar calendar in Islam.
