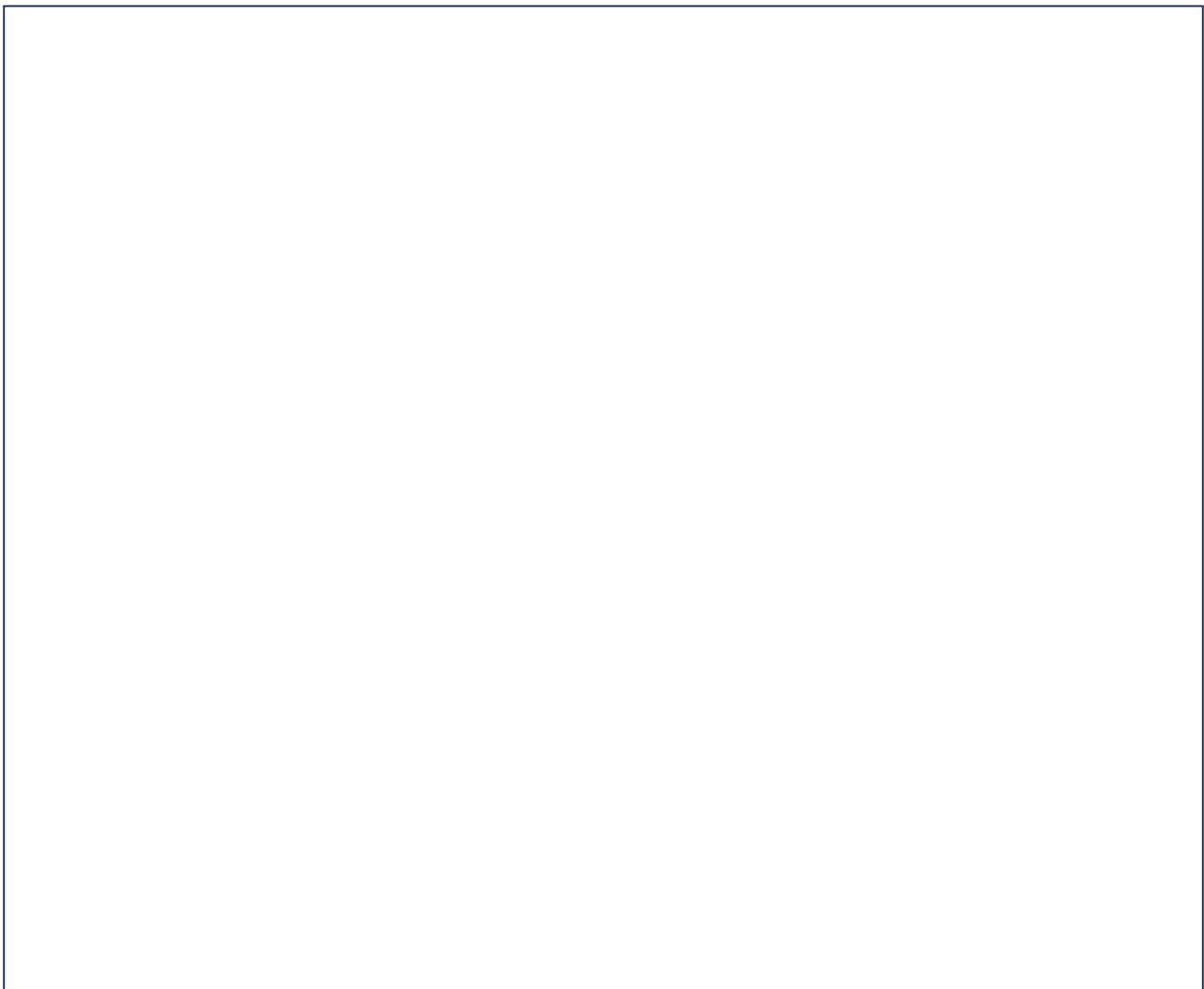


Exploring Moral Choices with Leo the Lion

Learning objective: To evaluate moral dilemmas and reflect on the concept of 'doing the right thing' by exploring character choices and consequences.

Use the drawing space provided to illustrate a moral dilemma. Think about how Leo the Lion might face a difficult decision where there is no single 'easy' answer. Use the word bank to label your scene.

Draw: Draw a split-screen scene featuring Leo the Lion. On the left side, show Leo holding a shiny, golden object in a dark forest (the dilemma). On the right side, draw two possible outcomes: one where he keeps the treasure and looks lonely, and one where he returns the treasure to a group of forest animals and looks proud. Use a clear, illustrative style with expressive facial features.



Label words: Consequences · Integrity · Dilemma · Empathy · Responsibility · Justice

Steps:

1. Explain why Leo might struggle to make a decision in this scenario. Consider the potential consequences of each choice.
2. Compare and contrast the immediate benefit of keeping the treasure versus the long-term benefit of returning it. Which choice shows more integrity?
3. Justify your answer: If you were in Leo's position, what would be the most important factor in your

decision-making process?

4. What might happen if Leo chose to keep the treasure and his friends found out later? Describe the impact on his relationships.
5. Label your drawing to show which part of your scene represents the 'dilemma' and which part represents the 'consequence'.
6. Create a speech bubble for Leo that expresses his internal conflict. What is he thinking or saying to himself?
