1. Introduction: Define what a 'sacred text' is and explain why it is considered different from an ordinary book. Start by writing: 'A sacred text is defined as...' (2 marks)

2. The Role of Authority: Explain how sacred texts provide guidance for believers. Consider: How do these texts influence the daily choices and moral decisions of a religious person? Start by writing: 'For many believers, these texts act as a compass because...' (3 marks)

3. Veneration and Respect: Describe how sacred texts are treated with care within their communities. Explain why this physical respect is shown. Start by writing: 'Communities often demonstrate their reverence for sacred texts by...' (2 marks)

4. Interpretation and Meaning: Discuss the idea that different people might interpret the same passage in different ways. Why might this lead to variety within a religion? Start by writing: 'One significant challenge is that sacred texts can be interpreted in multiple ways; this means that...' (3 marks)

5. Comparison: Compare and contrast how two different religions treat their sacred texts. What similarities can you identify? Start by writing: 'Although different religions have unique scriptures, they share similarities such as...' (3 marks)

6. Reflection: Justify why these texts have remained influential for thousands of years. What might happen if these texts were suddenly lost or forgotten? Start by writing: 'These texts have endured for centuries because...' (3 marks)

Extension challenge: Imagine you are a historian in the future discovering a new book of wisdom. Write a short 'sacred' passage of your own that contains a moral lesson for humanity. Explain why you chose the specific language and metaphors used in your text.
