Step into the season of crunching leaves and chilly breezes!

- As the weather gets colder in autumn, the temperature drops and we start to wear warmer clothes like coats and hats.
- Deciduous trees lose their leaves in autumn. They change colour from green to red, orange, and brown before falling to the ground.
- Many animals, such as hedgehogs, look for cosy places to sleep for a long time during the winter. This is called hibernation.
- The days become shorter in autumn, which means we have less daylight compared to the long, bright days of summer.
- Autumn is a time for harvesting crops like pumpkins, apples, and blackberries that have grown throughout the summer.
- Evergreen trees, such as pine trees, stay green all year round, even when the autumn leaves fall off other trees.

Did you know? Did you know? Some birds, like swallows, fly thousands of miles to warmer countries when autumn arrives because it is hard to find enough food in the cold UK winter. This is called migration!
