

Bea's Botanical Garden Adventure

Learning objective: To identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees, and describe the basic structure of a flowering plant.

Read each question carefully and use what you have learned about plants to help Bea the honeybee finish her garden journal.

Word bank: roots · stem · leaf · flower · petals · deciduous · evergreen

1. Bea is looking at a sunflower. Can you label the four main parts of the plant using the words in the bank? (4 marks)

2. What do we call a tree that keeps its green leaves all year round? (1 mark)

3. An oak tree loses its leaves in autumn. Is this tree deciduous or evergreen? (1 mark)

4. Why do plants need roots? Tick the best answer: To help them fly / To hold them in the soil and soak up water / To look pretty. (1 mark)

5. Max the monkey wants to buy a small potted plant for 70p. He has a 50p coin and a 20p coin. Does he have enough money? Explain how you know. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw your favourite garden plant. Make sure to draw the roots, the stem, the leaves, and the flower clearly.



Extension challenge: Go for a walk with an adult. Can you find three different types of leaves? Are they from a deciduous or an evergreen tree? Write down your findings in your science notebook.
