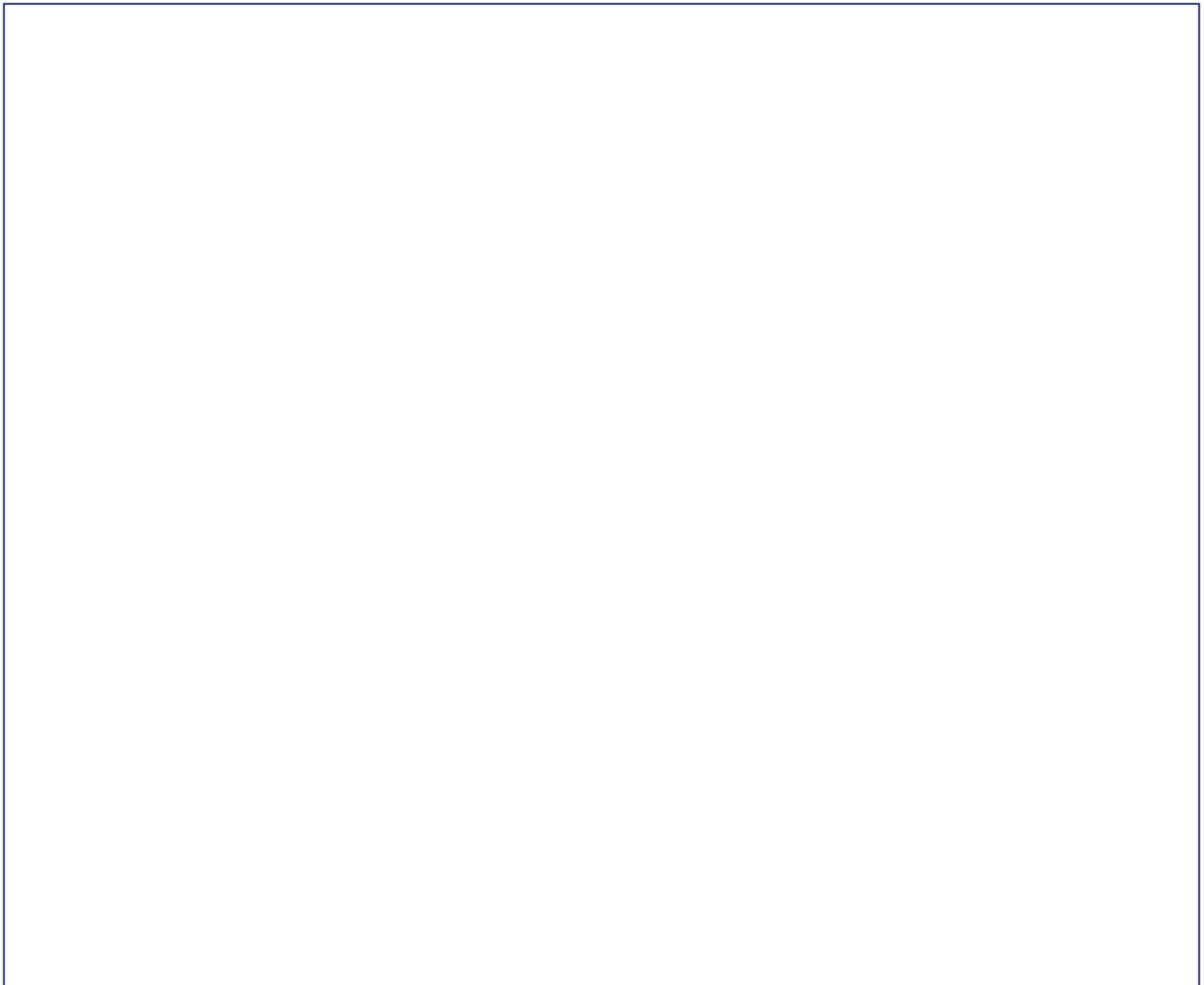


Nova's Seasonal Adventure

Learning objective: To observe and describe the changes across the four seasons.

Use your pencils and pens to complete the seasonal scene below. Think about what happens to the trees, the weather, and the clothes people wear during each time of year.

Draw: Draw a large circle divided into four equal quarters. In the first quarter (Spring), draw a tree with small green buds and flowers. In the second quarter (Summer), draw a bright sun and a green tree with full leaves. In the third quarter (Autumn), draw the same tree with orange and brown leaves falling off. In the fourth quarter (Winter), draw the tree with bare branches and white snow on the ground. You may add Nova the owl flying in the middle!



Label words: Spring · Summer · Autumn · Winter · Snow · Buds · Sun · Falling leaves

Steps:

1. Nova the owl is watching the garden. Label the four parts of your drawing to show which season is Spring, Summer, Autumn, and Winter.
2. What happens to the leaves on the trees during Autumn? Write one sentence.
3. Why do we wear a thick coat in Winter but not in Summer?
4. Which season comes after Winter? Draw a small flower to show this.
5. Look at your drawing. Which season has the hottest weather? Circle the sun in that section.
