

¡A Vestirse! (Getting Dressed)

¡Únete a Rosa la Loro y explora tu armario en español!

- To describe an item of clothing as feminine, we use the article 'la' for singular nouns or 'las' for plural nouns.
- For masculine items, we use 'el' for singular nouns or 'los' for plural nouns, such as 'el sombrero'.
- When choosing an outfit, remember: 'Yo llevo...' means 'I am wearing...'.
- Adjectives often follow the noun in Spanish, such as 'la camiseta roja' (the red t-shirt).
- Rosa reminds us that 'los zapatos' are plural because you always wear a pair of them!

Did you know? ¿Sabías que? In Spanish, clothing items are either masculine (el/los) or feminine (la/las). Much like a puzzle, the article must match the noun! For example, because 'pantalones' is plural, we use 'los' to describe them. Even when you are just talking about one pair of trousers, Spanish speakers treat them as a plural item!
