

Rosa's Wardrobe Designer: My Spanish Fashion Portfolio

Learning objective: To identify, describe, and categorise items of clothing in Spanish using adjectives for colour and size.

Rosa the parrot is preparing for a fashion show! Use this template to design an outfit and describe it using Spanish vocabulary. Refer to the word bank for help with nouns and adjectives. Ensure you use agreement between the noun and the adjective (e.g., 'una camiseta roja').

Word bank: la camiseta (t-shirt) · los pantalones (trousers) · la chaqueta (jacket) · el vestido (dress) · los zapatos (shoes) · la falda (skirt) · rojo/a (red) · azul (blue) · verde (green) · grande (big) · pequeño/a (small)

1. Outfit Selection: List three items of clothing you have chosen for your design. Write them in Spanish. (3 marks)

2. Descriptive Details: Describe your chosen items using colour and size adjectives. Why did you choose these specific colours? (4 marks)

3. Compare and Contrast: How does the Spanish sentence structure for 'a red shirt' (una camiseta roja) differ from the English structure? Justify why the adjective comes after the noun. (4 marks)

4. Contextual Application: If you were dressing for a cold winter day in Madrid, which items from your list would you choose? Explain your reasoning. (3 marks)

5. Critical Thinking: What might happen to the meaning of a Spanish sentence if you forgot to make the adjective agree with the gender of the noun? Provide an example. (4 marks)

6. Creative Synthesis: If you were designing a new item of clothing for Rosa to wear to a festival, what would it look like? Use at least three Spanish adjectives to describe it. (5 marks)

Extension challenge: Design a 'Spanish Fashion Forecast' for a specific season. Write a short paragraph in Spanish detailing what a person should wear and why, ensuring you use correct verb forms for 'llevar' (to wear).
