

¡A Jugar! (Let's Play!) - Hobbies in Spanish

Join Rosa the parrot on a linguistic adventure—discover how to talk about your favourite pastimes in Spanish!

- To express an opinion about a hobby, we begin with 'Me gusta' for things we enjoy or 'No me gusta' for things we do not enjoy.
- The phrase 'Jugar al' is used for sports, such as 'Jugar al fútbol' (playing football) or 'Jugar al tenis' (playing tennis).
- To ask a friend what they like to do, you can use the question: '¿Qué te gusta hacer?' (What do you like to do?).
- Spanish verbs for hobbies often end in -ar, such as 'nadar', 'dibujar', and 'bailar' (to dance).
- When listing multiple hobbies, you can use 'y' (and), for example: 'Me gusta nadar y leer'.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, when we want to say we really love a hobby, we can add the word 'mucho'. For example, 'Me gusta mucho leer' means 'I like reading a lot'. If you want to say something is your absolute favourite, you say 'Mi favorito es...' followed by the hobby!
