

Rosa's Spanish Number Adventure

Learning objective: To recall, identify and use Spanish numbers from 1 to 100 accurately within the context of a Year 5 curriculum.

Join Rosa the parrot on her flight across the Spanish-speaking world! Read the questions carefully, use your word bank for tricky spellings, and see if you can score 10/10.

Answer Key: 1. C (diez), 2. False (veinte is 20, not 12), 3. Quince, 4. B (cincuenta), 5. True, 6. Treinta, 7. A (uno), 8. False (cien is 100), 9. Setenta, 10. C (cuarenta).

What might happen if Spanish did not use a pattern for numbers above 20? 5. Create a word problem involving a shop purchase of £45 in Spanish. 6. Write a short poem where each line starts with a number in Spanish.
