

Rosa's Spanish Opinion Track Sheet

Learning objective: To learn how to express opinions in Spanish using simple phrases.

Read Rosa the parrot's Spanish phrases below. Use the word bank to help you answer the questions. Write your answers in the boxes provided.

Hola! I am Rosa. I love to talk about the things I like. In Spanish, we use 'Me gusta' to say we like something. If we really love it, we say 'Me encanta'. If we do not like it, we say 'No me gusta'. Look at my favourites: Me encanta el helado. Me gusta el fútbol. No me gusta leer.

Word bank: Me gusta (I like) · No me gusta (I do not like) · Me encanta (I love) · helado (ice cream) · fútbol (football) · leer (reading)

1. Rosa says 'Me encanta el helado'. What does this mean in English? (2 marks)

2. Which phrase would you use to say 'I do not like football'? (2 marks)

3. Rosa says 'Me gusta el fútbol'. Does she like or dislike football? (2 marks)

4. Write a sentence using 'Me encanta' to say you love something from the word bank. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of your favourite food and write 'Me gusta' or 'Me encanta' underneath it.



Extension challenge: Ask a partner what they like in Spanish using the phrase: '¿Te gusta...?'
