

¡Qué Opinión! Expressing Your Views in Spanish

Master the art of conversation with Rosa the Parrot—learn how to share your voice in Spanish!

- To express a strong positive preference, we use 'Me encanta', which translates to 'I love'.
- To give a reason for your opinion, we use the conjunction 'porque', which means 'because'.
- When you want to say something is boring, use the phrase 'Es aburrido'.
- To state a negative opinion, you place 'No' before the phrase: 'No me gusta' (I do not like).
- Adjectives like 'genial' are used to add detail to your opinion; these come after the verb 'es' (is).

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, when you use a verb after an opinion phrase, it stays in the infinitive form. For example, you would say 'Me gusta bailar' (I like to dance), using the base form of the verb rather than conjugating it!
