Learning objective: To express personal opinions in Spanish using phrases like 'Me gusta', 'No me gusta', and 'Me encanta', and to justify those opinions using connectives.

Join Rosa the parrot on a linguistic adventure! Read the questions carefully and choose the best Spanish phrase to share your thoughts. Remember to use your connectives to make your sentences more complex.

Extension challenge: Greater Depth Challenges: 1) Explain why using a variety of connectives (like 'pero' and 'porque') makes your Spanish writing more sophisticated. 2) Compare and contrast expressing opinions in Spanish versus English; what similarities do you notice? 3) Justify your answer: If you were describing a rainy day, which opinion phrase would you use and why? 4) What might happen if you forgot to use a connective when explaining your hobbies? 5) Create a complex sentence in Spanish that expresses two different opinions about the same subject. 6) How would you change your opinion phrase if you were speaking to a teacher compared to a friend?
