

Rosa's Market Adventure: A Spanish Shopping Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate competency in Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, currency conversion, and expressing preferences in a transactional context.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the parrot is visiting the local market. Use your knowledge of Spanish vocabulary and UK currency to complete the tasks. Write your answers clearly.

Rosa the parrot is at the bustling market. She is looking for fresh ingredients for a fruit salad and a new scarf for the autumn weather. She has £10.00 to spend. The apples cost 50p each, a bunch of grapes costs £1.50, and a woollen scarf costs £6.00.

1. Translate the following shopping phrases into Spanish: 'How much does it cost?' and 'I would like the fruit'. (2 marks)

2. If Rosa buys four apples and one bunch of grapes, calculate the total cost in pounds and pence. Show your working out. (3 marks)

3. Rosa sees a scarf for £6.00. Using the words 'caro' (expensive) or 'barato' (cheap), write a Spanish sentence explaining whether this item fits within her £10.00 budget. (3 marks)

4. Explain why it is important to understand the local currency when shopping in a Spanish-speaking country. Compare this to using pounds in the UK. (4 marks)

5. Rosa wants to buy a gift for her friend Leo the lion. The gift costs £3.50. If she has already spent her money on the apples, grapes, and scarf, does she have enough left? Justify your answer with a calculation. (4 marks)

6. Extended Writing: Imagine you are at a Spanish market. Write a dialogue (in Spanish with English translations) between you and a shopkeeper. You must ask for two items, ask the price, and decide whether to buy them based on your budget. Include at least four Spanish sentences. (9 marks)

Draw: Draw a Spanish market stall scene. Label at least three items of food or clothing using their correct Spanish names.
