

Spanish Shopping Adventure with Rosa

Learning objective: To confidently use vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and quantities in Spanish, applying these skills to real-world purchasing scenarios.

Help Rosa the parrot prepare for a Spanish market trip. Use the word bank to construct sentences, calculate totals in pounds and pence, and answer the challenge questions.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a bustling market in Spain. She needs to buy 3 apples at £0.50 each and 1 loaf of bread for £1.20. She has a £5.00 note in her purse.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?) · Cuesta... (It costs...) · Quisiera comprar (I would like to buy) · la fruta (the fruit) · el pan (the bread) · caro (expensive) · barato (cheap) · las monedas (the coins)

1. Translate the following request into Spanish: 'I would like to buy the fruit.' (1 mark)

2. Calculate the total cost of Rosa's shopping. Show your working out in pounds and pence. (2 marks)

3. If Rosa gives the shopkeeper a £5.00 note, how much change should she receive? Write your answer in a full Spanish sentence. (3 marks)

4. Explain why it is important to check your change when shopping at a market. How does this link to your maths skills? (3 marks)

5. Compare and contrast: If an item is 'caro' (expensive) versus 'barato' (cheap), how might your decision to purchase it change if you were on a strict budget? (3 marks)

6. Justify your answer: Rosa finds a rare book for £4.50. Is this a wise purchase given her current shopping list? Explain your reasoning. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a vibrant market stall in Spain with Rosa the parrot selecting items. Label at least three items in Spanish and include a price tag for each using the £ symbol.



Extension challenge: Imagine you are opening your own Spanish market stall. Create a list of five items you would sell. Write the name of each item in Spanish, set a price for each in pounds and pence, and write one persuasive sentence in Spanish to convince Rosa to buy your goods.
