

Rosa's Olympic Sports Fiesta: ¡El Deporte!

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary for common sports and express preferences using 'Me gusta' and 'No me gusta'.

Help Rosa the parrot design a colourful sports stadium! First, draw the scene described below. Then, use the word bank to label the different areas of your drawing. Finally, answer the questions to show off your Spanish skills.

Draw: Draw a large, vibrant sports stadium from an aerial view. Include a circular athletics track around the outside. Inside the track, divide the space into four quadrants: one for a football pitch, one for a basketball court, one for a swimming pool, and one for a tennis court. In the centre, draw Rosa the parrot cheering with a megaphone. Use bright colours and include labels for each zone using the provided Spanish vocabulary.



Label words: El fútbol (football) · El tenis (tennis) · La natación (swimming) · El baloncesto (basketball) · La pista de atletismo (athletics track) · La pelota (the ball) · La raqueta (the racket) · Me gusta (I like) · No me gusta (I do not like)

Steps:

1. Label three different pieces of sports equipment in your drawing using the correct Spanish nouns from the word bank.

2. Write a sentence in Spanish stating which sport you have drawn and whether you like it. Example: 'Me gusta el fútbol.'
3. Explain why it is important for a stadium to have a variety of different areas for sports, rather than just one. Justify your answer using vocabulary related to health and exercise.
4. Compare and contrast two sports from your drawing. How does the equipment differ? Use the Spanish words for the equipment to support your answer.
5. What might happen if Rosa decided to add a new, unusual sport to her stadium? How would you describe this sport in Spanish?
6. If you were designing a ticket for this event, what details would you include to ensure the audience knows exactly where to go? Write these in Spanish.
