

¡Vamos! Transport in Spain

- To say you are travelling by a specific mode of transport, use the word 'en' before the vehicle, for example: 'Voy en tren'.
- When you are walking, you use the special phrase 'a pie' instead of using 'en'.
- The word 'el' is used for masculine nouns like 'el coche' and 'el avión'.
- The word 'la' is used for feminine nouns like 'la bicicleta'.
- To ask how someone is travelling, you can say: '¿Cómo vas?' (How are you going?).

Did you know? ¿Sabías qué? (Did you know?) Spain has one of the largest high-speed rail networks in the world, known as the AVE. It connects major cities like Madrid and Barcelona in record time, travelling at speeds of up to 310 kilometres per hour!
