

¡Qué tiempo hace! (What is the weather like?)

Join Rosa the parrot on a sunny expedition—learn to talk about the weather in Spanish!

- To describe a beautiful, bright day, we use the phrase 'Hace sol'.
- When the temperature drops and it feels chilly, we say 'Hace frío'.
- If you see grey clouds gathering in the sky, you can say 'Está nublado'.
- When the rain begins to fall, the correct Spanish verb is 'Llueve'.
- If the trees are swaying because it is breezy, we say 'Hace viento'.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spain, the weather can vary significantly depending on the region! While the south is often dry and warm, the northern mountainous regions, like the Picos de Europa, can experience much cooler temperatures and frequent rain. Speaking of weather, if you ever visit a Spanish-speaking country, you can ask '¿Qué tiempo hace?' to find out if you need an umbrella or sunglasses!
