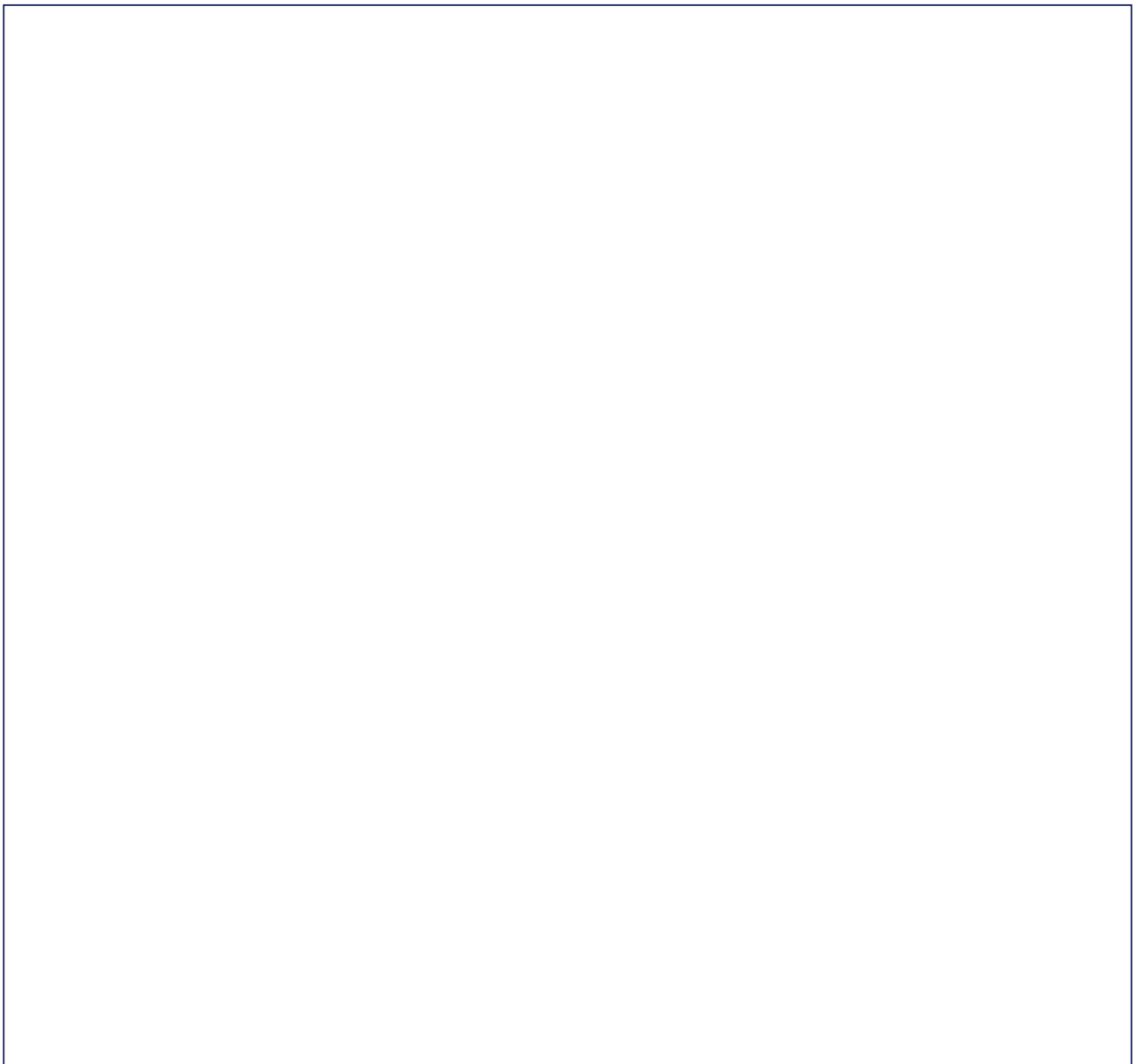


Zara's Colorful Garden

Learning objective: To explore primary colors and discover how they can be mixed to create new colors.

Help Zara the zebra bring her garden to life! Use red, yellow, and blue crayons to color the primary shapes, then see if you can mix them to color the flowers.

Colour this: A large, friendly zebra named Zara standing in a garden. Zara has simple, bold stripes. Around her are three large flowers with circular centres and petal outlines. One flower has a large letter 'R' inside (for Red), one has 'Y' (for Yellow), and one has 'B' (for Blue). In the background, draw two smaller flowers that are half-shaded with patterns to show where colors meet. Include a bright sun in the corner and a few simple shapes of leaves on stems for the children to color green.



Steps:

1. Label the primary color flower in your picture.
2. Label the secondary color leaf in your picture.
