1. An adjective is a word that describes a noun. Can you circle the two adjectives in this sentence: 'The small monkey ate a sweet apple.' (2 marks)

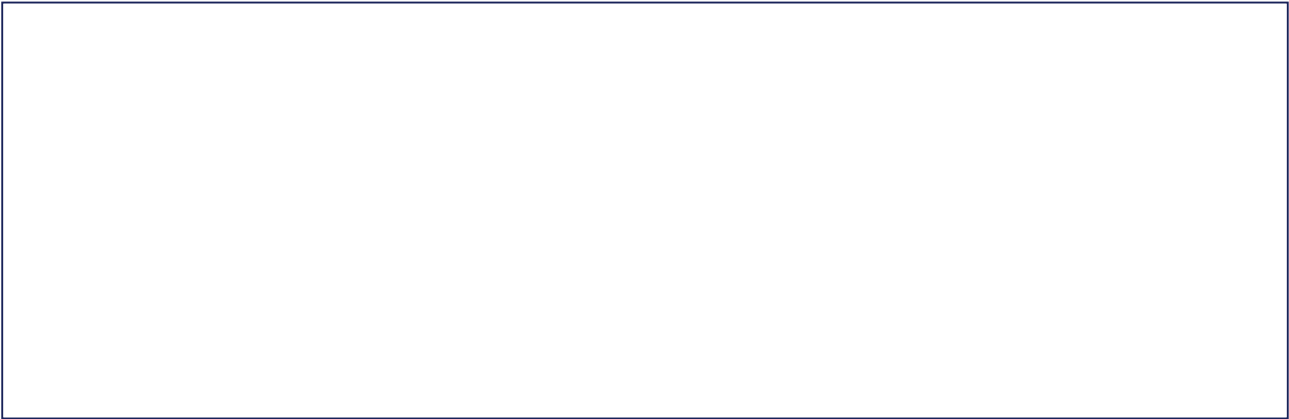
2. Look at the passage about Max. Find one adjective used to describe the key. (2 marks)

5. Imagine you are describing a magical forest to Nova the owl. Write 3-4 sentences about what you see. Use at least four adjectives to make your writing interesting. (Sentence starter: I can see a...) (13 marks)
