

A Snowy Surprise: Christmas Story Assessment

Learning objective: To show understanding of a story, identify character feelings, and write a short descriptive paragraph.

Read the story below carefully. Answer the questions in the boxes provided. Use the word bank if you need help with your spelling.

It was Christmas Eve in the Silver Forest. Pip the caterpillar was wrapped in a tiny, woolly scarf. The ground was covered in white, powdery snow. Pip saw a shivering bird who had no food. Pip shared his pile of winter berries with the bird. The sun set and the stars began to glow. Pip felt very happy because he had helped a friend. He knew that the best part of Christmas was being kind to others.
