

Grade 3 ELA: Conjunction Challenge with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To use and identify coordinating and subordinating conjunctions to join clauses together.

Read each question carefully. Max the Monkey needs your help to finish his sentences. Use the word bank to help you choose the best joining word.

Max the Monkey loves solving puzzles. He is very clever. He likes to count bananas. He likes to count apples. Sometimes Max feels tired. He always keeps working. He will be happy. He finishes all his sums.
