

The Story of Diwali with Pip

Learning objective: To understand the key events in the story of Diwali and use descriptive language.

Read the story below. Use the word bank to help you answer the questions. You can use the sentence starters to help you write your answers.

Pip the caterpillar loves to read stories about light and kindness. One of Pip's favorite stories is about Diwali. Long ago, a prince named Rama and his wife Sita had to go away from their home. They were away for a very long time. The people in their city missed them very much. When Rama and Sita finally returned home, the people were so happy. They wanted to show the way home in the dark. They lit hundreds of small clay lamps. The light from the lamps shone brightly in the night. This is why Diwali is called the Festival of Light. It is a time to celebrate goodness and victory over darkness.
