1. Introduction: Write a brief opening paragraph introducing your subject and explaining why it is an important part of the natural world. (3 marks)

3. Habitat and Diet: Where does your subject live? What does it eat and how does it find its food in the wild? (3 marks)

4. Amazing Adaptations: List three special skills or body parts that help your subject survive in its environment. (3 marks)

5. Did You Know?: Write one or two surprising facts that would amaze a reader, just like Nova the owl! (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Research a second subject and create a comparison table. How does your first subject differ from the second in terms of habitat and diet? Use a ruler to draw your table neatly.
