Learning objective: To identify and use the features of a non-chronological report.

Read the report below. Use the information to answer the questions. Use the word bank to help you.

The Amazing Honeybee. Honeybees are flying insects. They live in large groups called colonies. A colony has one queen bee. Thousands of worker bees live in the hive too. Honeybees help flowers grow by moving pollen from plant to plant. This is called pollination. Bees make honey from flower nectar. They store the honey in wax cells inside their hive. Bees are very important for our world.
