Read each card carefully. The front features a challenge or definition, and the back provides the solution. Use these to test your logic and vocabulary skills!

Analogy: Max is to Monkey as Finn is to...	Synonym: Which word is a synonym for 'cheerful'? (a) Gloomy (b) Joyful (c) Angry
Dolphin	(b) Joyful
Antonym: What is the antonym of 'ancient'?	Word Pattern: If CAT is 3-1-20, what is DOG? (A=1, B=2, C=3...)
Modern or New	4-15-7
Classification: Which word is the odd one out? Apple, Banana, Carrot, Pear	Analogy: Pip is to Book as Nova is to...
Carrot (it is a vegetable, others are fruits)	Telescope or Stars
Letter Sequence: A, C, E, G, ... What is the next letter?	Logic: If all elephants have trunks and Ellie is an elephant, what must be true?
I (skipping one letter each time)	Ellie has a trunk
Word Building: Add a suffix to 'kind' to make a noun.	Numerical Reasoning: If 3 apples cost £1.50, how much does 1 apple cost?
Kindness	£0.50 (or 50p)
Hidden Word: Find the word hidden inside: 'The star shines bright.'	Analogy: Paint is to Zara as Code is to...
