

Grade 3 Geography Assessment: Continents and Oceans

Learning objective: To identify, name, and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you need help with spelling. Finn the Dolphin is here to help you navigate your way through the questions!

Finn the dolphin loves to swim across the big blue oceans. He travels from the freezing Arctic to the warm Indian Ocean. Along the way, he passes many large pieces of land called continents. Finn uses his map to keep track of where he is.

1. 1. There are seven continents in the world. Write down the names of any two continents. (2 marks)

2. 2. There are five oceans in the world. Name one ocean that Finn the dolphin might swim in. (1 mark)

3. 3. Look at a world map. Is the United Kingdom part of the continent of Europe, or the continent of Asia? (2 marks)

4. 4. Why is Antarctica different from the other continents? Think about the weather there. (4 marks)

5. 5. Imagine you are Finn the dolphin. Describe a journey from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific Ocean. Which continents would you swim past? Use the word bank to help you. (5 marks)

6. 6. True or False: The Arctic Ocean is the smallest ocean in the world. (2 marks)

7. 7. Which continent is also a country and is surrounded by water? (2 marks)

8. 8. Circle the largest continent on the map provided by your teacher. (2 marks)

9. 9. If you were traveling from North America to South America, would you go North or South? (2 marks)

10. 10. Name the ocean that is located between Africa and Australia. (3 marks)
