

Exploring Our World with Finn the Dolphin

Learning objective: To identify and describe the world's continents and oceans.

Use these prompts to write a report about our planet. Use the word bank to help your sentences flow. Look at the example sentence and follow the structure below.

Finn the dolphin has travelled all over the globe, and he has discovered that our world is made up of seven large land masses called continents and five vast oceans.

1. The Continents: Start by naming two or three continents. You could start your sentence with: 'One continent I have learned about is...' (2 marks)

2. The Oceans: Describe where the oceans are found. You could start your sentence with: 'The oceans are important because...' (2 marks)

3. Comparing Sizes: Which continent is the biggest and which is the smallest? You could start your sentence with: 'I found out that the largest continent is...' (2 marks)

4. Finn's Favorite: Where would you like to visit? You could start your sentence with: 'If I could travel with Finn, I would go to...' (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Can you draw a simple map of the world and label the five oceans? Use a blue pencil for the water and a green pencil for the land.
