There are three main countries: Canada, the United States of America (USA), and Mexico.

Which major mountain range stretches through western North America?

The Rocky Mountains.

What is the name of the large group of freshwater lakes located on the border between Canada and the USA?

The Great Lakes.

Which ocean lies to the west of North America?

The Pacific Ocean.

Which ocean lies to the east of North America?

The Atlantic Ocean.

What is the longest river system in North America?

The Mississippi-Missouri river system.

True or False: North America is the third-largest continent in the world.

True.

What type of cold, treeless biome is found in the northern parts of Canada?

The Tundra.

Which country in North America is the largest by land area?

Canada.

What is the name of the hot, dry region found in parts of Mexico and the Southwestern USA?

A desert (such as the Sonoran or Chihuahuan Desert).

Finn is swimming near the southern tip of North America; which sea is he likely in?

The Caribbean Sea.

What do we call the imaginary line that divides the Northern and Southern Hemispheres, which North America sits entirely north of?

The Equator.
