

# Settlement Superstars: Geography Flashcards

*Learning objective: To identify and define key terms related to human settlements, including site, situation, and land use.*

## What is a Settlement?

A place where people live and build their homes, which can range from a single house to a large city.

## What is the difference between a Rural and an Urban settlement?

A rural settlement is in the countryside, such as a village or farm, while an urban settlement is a built-up area like a town or city.

## What does 'Site' mean in geography?

The actual piece of land upon which a settlement is built, considering things like the type of soil or access to water.

## What is a 'Situation' in geography?

The position of a settlement in relation to its surrounding features, such as nearby mountains, rivers, or other towns.

## What is a Conurbation?

A massive urban area formed when several towns and cities grow and merge together into one continuous built-up area.

## What is meant by 'Land Use'?

How the land in a settlement is utilised by people, such as for housing (residential), shops (commercial), or factories (industrial).

## What is Infrastructure?

The basic physical systems of a settlement, including roads, bridges, water supply, and electricity grids that allow it to function.

## What is Population Density?

The measurement of how many people live in a specific area, usually calculated per square kilometre.

## Define a 'Hamlet'.

A very small settlement, usually smaller than a village, often having few or no services like shops or schools.

## Why might a settlement be built near a river?

Historically, rivers provided fresh water, a method of transport for trade, and a power source for early mills.

## What is a 'Brownfield site'?

Land that has been built on before and is now being redeveloped for new housing or commercial use.

## What is a 'Greenfield site'?

An area of open land in a rural area that has not been built on previously and is being considered for new development.
