4. Why do countries need to trade with each other? (Hint: Think about things we cannot grow or make in the UK). (2 marks)

5. List two items you think the UK might buy (import) from other countries. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a large ship crossing the ocean. On the ship, draw two things that might be traded, like a crate of bananas or a box of toys.
