Learning objective: To show your knowledge of life in Ancient Greece.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you need help with spelling. Write your answers clearly on the lines provided.

6. Extended Writing: Imagine you live in Ancient Greece. Write 3-4 sentences describing your home and what you do during the day. Use words from the word bank. (10 marks)
