

Exploring Beliefs: Life After Death

Learning objective: To understand different religious perspectives regarding life after death.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions below using full sentences.

Across the world, people hold different beliefs about what happens after a person dies. Many religions believe that death is not the end, but a transition to a new stage of existence. For instance, many Christians believe in an afterlife, a place often described as heaven or paradise, where the soul lives on in peace. In this tradition, how a person lived their life on Earth is very important. Similarly, many Muslims believe in Akhirah, an eternal life after death, where individuals are rewarded for their good deeds and faith. In contrast, some Eastern religions, such as Hinduism and Buddhism, teach the concept of reincarnation. This is the belief that the soul is reborn into a new body after death. They believe that a person's actions, known as karma, influence the life they will lead next. While these traditions differ in their specific details, they all share a common theme: the idea that human existence continues beyond our physical lives. These beliefs provide comfort and guidance to millions of people as they navigate the big questions of life and purpose.
