

Exploring Everyday Materials with Nova the Owl

Learning objective: To identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock.

Look at the scene with Nova. Color the different objects in the picture. Once you have finished, use the labels to identify what each object is made of.

Colour this: A clear, bold line drawing of a garden scene. Nova the Owl is perched on a sturdy wooden fence made of planks. Below her, there is a metal watering can, a transparent glass jar containing water, a small pile of grey rocks, and a child's toy block made of wood. Nearby, a plastic ball sits on the grass. The lines should be thick and easy for Kindergarten children to color in.



Steps:

1. Label the bucket that is made of metal.
2. Label the window that is made of glass.
3. Label the toy block that is made of wood.
